From Your Pastor

Most of us remember a favorite teacher—whether we enjoyed school or not. I attended a Lutheran parochial school for eight years. My favorite teacher was Mr. Dougherty, my 7th and 8th grade teacher. In fact, I know that a good deal of how I teach and handle a classroom was shaped by him. Mr. Dougherty taught me both by words and by example.

Teaching and learning are at the core of our Christian faith and life. We would be hopelessly lost in our sins and facing eternal condemnation if we had not been taught the truth of God's Word. The Word of God has some very unflattering descriptions of how we are by nature in relation to the things of God, including words like "ignorant," and "foolish" (from which we get the word "moron").

We must be taught what sin is and what sin's consequences are or we will keep on rushing from bad to worse (2 Timothy 3:13). We must be taught the truth of God's Word that "the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Jesus Christ our Lord" (Romans 6:23).

This truth—the truth that God has given to us a Savior from our sin and rescue from eternal punishment for our sin—this truth was at the center and core of Jesus' teaching. It is the center and core of the entire Bible. Jesus went about "teaching." Jesus taught disciples, and the word "disciple" literally means "one who learns," "one who follows."

Jesus made a very significant promise to His disciples in the Upper Room on the night in which He was betrayed. Jesus promised, "The Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you" (John 14:26). Jesus also then said, "When He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all truth. . . . He will bring glory to Me by taking from what is Mine and making it known to you" (John 16:13a & 14). The Holy Spirit was poured out upon the Church on the Day of Pentecost, which we will celebrate on Sunday, May 19. Martin Luther summarized the work of the Holy Spirit as the Bible teaches in his explanation of the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed: "The Holy Spirit

has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith."

Each one of us is to remain a life-long learner and each of us is to be part of the task which Jesus has given to His Church: "Go and *make disciples [learners and followers]* of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and *teaching* them to obey *everything* I have commanded you" (Matt. 28:19-20, emphasis added).

Each of us should be making effort to be daily reading our Bibles, so that the Holy Spirit can teach us. Each of us should also be making effort to join in the study of the Word of God in a Bible Class. The example of the Christians in the Book of Acts is "They continued steadfast in the Apostles' teaching" ("Acts 2:42, emphasis added).

Think you can't spare an hour to study the Word of God with other Christians? Think of this: every week has 168 hours. One hour out of that 168 is only .006 of the week (not even one percent of your week!). Even coupled with an hour or so in worship once a week, we are still only spending just a little over one percent of our week in concentrated focus on God's Word. God is the Giver of all. You will be blessed far more richly by God with what truly matters than anything else you can do in that hour.

Our Bible Studies are all non-threatening to our participants. No one is forced to read aloud. We take time to make sure everyone is on the same page. We welcome every question. We have fun together, and even more importantly, growing in God's grace given through His Word enables us to "grow up in [our] salvation" (1 Peter 2:2) and keeps us from "being ineffective and unproductive in [our] knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 1:8).

We have the great privilege and joy of being learners and teachers of the greatest message of all—Jesus our Savior and our life in Him!



This book is about a 15 year old girl from Norway standing on the deck of the ocean liner United States looking at the Statue of Liberty. When she was 5 years old her mother had fled to America leaving her and her brother Joe behind with an aunt. Her mother met her at Ellis Island.

Elvine started her life in America as a servant girl in a Jewish home on Park Avenue, New York City. She worked with her hands and learned with her heart. She changed her name to Ella.

She took her Bible and walked to the Baptist Mission to hear the new pastor, Rev. Mr. Elius Tweten. The pastor had been an orphan also from Norway and in America only a few years. As he looked over his first congregation he eyed Ella and he was determined that she should be his wife.

Over a cup of hot chocolate after church and some conversation they were married three months later.

Little did she know what her life would be like married to a minister that when he got a call they would be packing up everything they had and moving to a new city, town, or village.

Even in the remotest areas there was always a pot of coffee and God was always her right hand. She put everything in God's hands, raising a family of six children and anyone her husband brought home that needed food, clothes, help of any kind. There was always the mission basket, she would make a piece of clothes from whatever. Her stand by was, God will provide.

Make sure you put this book on your reading list. It may bring a smile to your face and a tear to your eye but I'm sure you will enjoy it.

Pastor Mahnken's Report Voters' Meeting--April 21, 2024

We began 2024 with 623 baptized members and 514 communicant members on the books. So far this year six members have died—Elaine Friedrichsen, Gaylord Boeck, Kathy Korner, Tom Bubke, Jim Aldag, and Roger Chisholm. We have had one baptism; one member added by affirmation of faith, and two transfers in. 8 baptized members were added to our communicant role by Jr. Confirmation. As of today we have 621 baptized members and 519 communicant members on our roll.

Our Lent Midweek worship average attendance was 73, which was exactly the same as it was last year, but down from the 87 we averaged in 2022. Thanks again to all who prepared and served our meals—it is a demonstration of how we love one another. The conversations we share during those meal times can be a time of blessing and care for one another. We were blessed to have Pr. Steve Schulz taking a turn with Pr. Kaiser and me in preaching for those services. Our Maundy Thursday attendance was one less than last year, but you have to go back to 2012 to find a year when we had more. Our Good Friday attendance was the most we had since 2013, and it was greater than our Maundy Thursday attendance for the first time since 2016. Sometimes, weather plays a factor in those attendances. Our Easter attendance was just a bit above last year, but our Easter worship has not near rebounded to the attendance levels we had before Covid. We want to thank our youth and their parents for preparing and serving the Easter Breakfast.

Thanks to Chris, my wife, for teaching 5th & 6th Grade Confirmation again this year. She used to teach 5th Grade, but now the classes are combined. Thanks also to Nancy Bielenberg for helping out teaching the 5th & 6th grade class for some weeks. Thanks also to Melanie Hargens for assisting me with the 7th & 8th Grade Confirmation Class. She quizzed Memory Work and helped out with the class a couple of times when I was gone. Next year we will not have Confirmation as we have no 8th Graders. I will be teaching 7th Graders who will be eligible for Confirmation in 2026.

Thanks also to our Sunday School Superintendents Laura Ernst and Kristin Hennings. They do more than normal Superintendent work as one or the other is also often teaching. I don't know if you have noticed the Sunday School attendance numbers but sometimes it is quite low—for multiple reasons. Some parents do not bring their children to Sunday School. There are also so many other activities scheduled on Sundays which pull our

families away. It becomes more and more of a challenge to teach the faith when children are not regularly attending Sunday School from the earliest ages. Please continue to pray for the Holy Spirit to enlighten and guide our parents and to bless and protect our children in true faith and Christian living—especially as we are in a world that is not only indifferent to the Christian faith but openly and actively hostile to the faith.

March 23 we had some families participate in packing at Mercy Meals of Siouxland. Other groups were there and it was good to be part of the largest number of packers for a day at Mercy Meals since before Covid.

The time of service of Interim Pastor Bill Wrede, who has been serving Zion, Denison, is coming to a close at the end of this month. Zion has a Call List and will soon be calling a new pastor. I do not know of Zion's arrangements for pastoral ministry in the meantime.

Pastor Neil Wehmas was installed as the sole pastor of St. Paul in Ida Grove. St. Paul had two pastors for many years, but now just Pastor Wehmas.

The fewer number of pastors in the area puts a greater workload on them. We take turns doing worship at nursing homes more frequently as well as recording for Thy Strong Word, etc. Please keep on praying for more pastors and other church workers!

Please plan to attend our Denison and Mapleton Circuits' worship at Mission Central on Ascension Day, Thursday, May 9. We will have a meal at 5:00 p.m. and the service will begin at 6:30 p.m. The preacher for the service will be Pastor Chris Tiews, who is a missionary serving in Germany.

Finally, I again remind you of my prayer challenge for us all: "Please join me three times a day in prayer for the spiritual growth of the members of Immanuel. Please pray three times a day—following the example of Daniel in Daniel 6! Pray that the eyes of our hearts may be opened to the wonder of God's grace. Pray for the Holy Spirit to be at work among us. Pray on behalf of the families and children of Immanuel that they will be blessed with a love for Jesus and a growing zeal to live for Him in this darkening age. Yes, continue to pray, but we also need to continue to invite and teach and grow in ministry to help one another grow up in our salvation (1 Peter 2:2).

I thank you for your prayers.

Mute Listener Speaks! Mr. Kassa lives in Ethiopia's Eastern Oromia region. This healthy man was suddenly struck mute six months ago. Despite all treatments, the man could hear but could not speak a word. Last month, Mr. Kassa heard the Word of God being preached on the Oromo ARM radio program. Later, the preacher offered a prayer for the healing of the sick. Mr. Kassa recalled saying "Amen" silently in his heart. God healed Mr. Kassa and restored his speech! The following week, he called the office to praise God and give his testimony.

Conference Strengthens Prison Ministry. At a 3-day conference, the ARM Prison Ministry was featured and hundreds of Christians gathered. Donations were collected to share God's love with inmates. Everyone was encouraged to visit nearby prisons and participate.

Prison Ministry-Harvest is Plentiful. Yirgalem Prison holds over 4,000 inmates, including 500 Christians. The prison is extremely overcrowded and the women and children are in a particularly sad situation, lacking adequate food and clothing. The Prison Commander has pleaded for assistance for these female prisoners and their children. Recently, during a prayer meeting, the 25-year old chapel collapsed, seriously injuring two inmates. A new chapel is currently under construction, but prayers are needed to provide funding to complete the project. Despite their difficult circumstances, 25 inmates recently came to understand God's grace, trusting in Christ as their Lord and Savior. As they persevere through seemingly hopeless situations, we pray their hearts will be filled with Jesus' Easter hope-filled miracles.

West Africa Updates

LIBERIA: The Shame is Gone-New Life in Christ! Mr. Jabbah was not interested in Christianity and had made bad choices in his life. This caused him to be rejected by his Christian family, friends, and neighbors. As a result, he developed a negative perception of Christianity and became even more alienated from his loved ones. However, one day he heard the Gospel preached on the radio in his Kissi dialect. This prompted him to call Rev. Ezekiel Saah, the radio pastor, who prayed with him and answered many of his questions. Rev. Saah invited him to the new Lutheran Preaching Point and assured him of a warm welcome. Since attending Hope Lutheran Church, Mr. Jabbah has experienced God's love through the people there, and feels Christ's love washing away the shame of his past life. His is learning all he can about Jesus.
