


THE OPENING VERSES

THE PSALM Psalm 103:1-18 (ESV)

Advent: Praise to You. O Christ.

- P: Bless the LORD, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless His holy name!
- C: Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits,
- P: who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases,
- C: who redeems your life from the pit,
- P: who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy,
- C: who satisfies you with good so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.

- P: The LORD works righteousness and justice for all who are oppressed.
- C: He made known His ways to Moses, His acts to the people of Israel.
- P: The LORD is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.
- C: He will not always accuse, nor will He keep His anger forever.
- P: He does not deal with us according to our sins,
- C: nor repay us according to our iniquities.

- P: For as high as the heavens are above the earth,
- C: so great is His steadfast love toward those who fear Him;
- P: as far as the east is from the west,
- C: so far does He remove our transgressions from us.
- P: As a father shows compassion to his children,
- C: so the LORD shows compassion to those who fear Him.
- P: For He knows our frame; He remembers that we are dust.
- C: As for man, his days are like grass; he flourishes like a flower of the field;
- P: for the wind passes over it, and it is gone, and its place knows it no more.
- C: But the steadfast love of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear Him,
- P: and His righteousness to children's children,
- C: to those who keep His covenant and remember to do His commandments. Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.





THE RESPONSORY FOR ADVENT


P: Behold, the days are coming, says the Lord, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch.
