From Your Pastor

One of the resources I use for my devotional time has the title *The Lord Will Answer*. It is published by Concordia Publishing House, and it has a subtitle, "A Daily Prayer Catechism." It follows *Luther's Small Catechism* and covers it in the course of a year, so it is an excellent way to review the Small Catechism. Several Bible passages are given for each day which support the teaching in focus, and then there is a prayer, written by one of the Church Fathers.

Sometimes, the prayer provided is of a different type. What is most remarkable is the form of these prayers. The editor took a prayer of one of the characters of the Bible and adapted it for our personal use. One of the prayers is based on a prayer by Nehemiah, as it is recorded in Nehemiah 1:5-11.

Nehemiah was one of God's people who came into the service of the king of Persia while God's people were in exile. Some of God's people had been permitted to return to begin rebuilding the temple and the city of Jerusalem. As the book of Nehemiah begins, he tells of hearing that those who had gone back to Jerusalem were in great trouble and shame. The wall of Jerusalem remained broken down and its gates destroyed by fire. Nehemiah understood this as God's call to him to go back and organize the work (we learn Nehemiah was a great administrator), but he first had to gain permission from the Persian king, whom he served. Nehemiah poured out his heart to God in prayer.

First, read what Nehemiah prayed, and then I will share how the editor of The Lord Will Answer adapted it for our use. Here is Nehemiah's prayer: "O LORD God of heaven, the great and awesome God who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love Him and keep His commandments, let Your ear be attentive and Your eyes open, to hear the prayer of Your servant that I now pray before You day and night for the people of Israel, Your servants, confessing the sins of the people of Israel, which we have sinned against You. Even I and my father's house have sinned. We have acted very corruptly against You and have not kept the commandments, the statutes, and the rules that You commanded Your servant Moses. Remember the word that You commanded Your servant Moses, saying, 'If you are unfaithful, I will scatter you among the peoples, but if you return to Me and keep My commandments and do them, though your outcasts are in the uttermost parts of heaven, from there I will gather them and bring them to the place that I have chosen, to make My name dwell there.' They are Your servants and Your people, whom You have redeemed by Your great power and by Your strong hand. O Lord, let Your ear be attentive to the prayer of Your servant, and to the prayer of Your servants who delight to fear Your name, and give success to Your servant today, and grant him mercy in the sight of this man" (Nehemiah 1:5-11).

Now here is how the prayer was personalized by the editor of The Lord Will Answer: "O Lord, God of heaven, the great and awesome God, who keeps His covenant of love with those who love Him and obey His commands, let Your ear be attentive and Your eyes open to hear the prayer Your servant is praying before You day and night for Your servants, the people of God. I confess the sins we have committed against You, including my sins and the sins of my father's house. We have acted very wickedly toward You. We have not obeyed the commands, decrees, and laws You gave. Cause us to return to You and obey Your commands through Jesus Christ our Savior. Gather us in His Name. Redeem us by Your great strength and Your mighty hand. O Lord, let Your ear be attentive to the prayer of this Your servant and to the prayer of Your servants who delight in revering Your name. Give success today by granting favor through Christ. Amen."







He wondered what were the facts behind a covert trial that drove the Cavanaugh family apart. He is also not prepared for how much his life can change in a matter of days.

But isn't it amazing to think about how someone shared Jesus with a woman over fifty years ago and she held on tight to that love? I pray that as we've gone through our year and as we head into Easter teaching season, the students who God has sent to Immanuel Lutheran Preschool will have the truth of God's love, grace, and victory rooted so deeply in them that they will hold on tight to it forever. Or perhaps I should say, I pray they will allow Him to hold onto their little hand in complete rest and trust.
