"A Time to Remember"

AS WE GATHER

"It has long been the custom of our people to turn in the fruitful autumn of the year in praise and thanksgiving to Almighty God for His many blessings and mercies to us." These words written by President Woodrow Wilson for Thanksgiving one hundred years ago are just as timely now as they were then. We are a blessed people, and there is so much for which we can turn in praise and thanksgiving to God! As the Lord Jesus sets a Thanksgiving banquet before you today in His Word, join with your Christian family to turn and give Him thanks and praise for the saving work He does in your life. "Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; for His steadfast love endures forever!" (Psalm 118:1).

THE EUCHARIST is one of the names for the **Lord's Supper**, and it means "Thanksgiving". THE INVOCATION AND OPENING VERSES

- P: In the name of the Father and of the

 Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- P: I will praise the name of God with a song;
- C: I will magnify Him with thanksgiving.
- P: Enter His gates with thanksgiving, and His courts with praise!
- C: Give thanks to Him; bless His name!

THE CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION Deuteronomy 8:6

- P: You shall keep the commandments of the LORD your God
- C: by walking in His ways and by fearing Him.
- P: Since we are gathered to hear God's Word, to bow before Him in thanksgiving, and to receive Christ's body and blood in the Lord's Supper, let us first confess before our holy God and one another that we have sinned in thought, word, and deed. We daily fall short of His glory. We can never purify ourselves from our sins. Together, as His family in Jesus Christ, let us seek our Father's cleansing forgiveness.
- C: Almighty God, have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting life. Amen.
- P: Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; for His mercy endures forever!

 Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ♣ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

THE OLD TESTAMENT READING Deuteronomy 8:1-14, 17-20 (ESV)

"The whole commandment that I command you today you shall be careful to do, that you may live and multiply, and go in and possess the land that the Lord swore to give to your fathers. And you shall remember the whole way that the Lord your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, that He might humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep His commandments or not. And He humbled you and let you hunger and fed you with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, that He might make you know that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord. Your clothing did not wear out on you and your foot did not swell these forty years. Know then in your heart that, as a man disciplines his son, the Lord your God disciplines you. So you shall keep the commandments of the Lord your God by walking in His ways and by fearing Him. For the Lord your God is bringing you into a good land, a land of brooks of water, of fountains and springs, flowing out in the valleys and hills, a land of wheat and barley, of vines

and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive trees and honey, a land in which you will eat bread without scarcity, in which you will lack nothing, a land whose stones are iron, and out of whose hills you can dig copper. And you shall eat and be full, and you shall bless the Lord your God for the good land He has given you. Take care lest you forget the LORD your God by not keeping His commandments and His rules and His statutes, which I command you today, lest, when you have eaten and are full and have built good houses and live in them, and when your herds and flocks multiply and your silver and gold is multiplied and all that you have is multiplied, then your heart be lifted up, and you forget the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery Beware lest you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth.' You shall remember the LORD your God, for it is He who gives you power to get wealth, that He may confirm His covenant that He swore to your fathers, as it is this day. And if you forget the LORD your God and go after other gods and serve them and worship them, I solemnly warn you today that you shall surely perish. Like the nations that the LORD makes to perish before you, so shall you perish, because you would not obey the voice of the LORD your God."

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

THE EPISTLE 1 Timothy 2:1-4 (ESV)

First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

THE HOLY GOSPEL Luke 17:11-19 (ESV)

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the seventeenth chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

On the way to Jerusalem [Jesus] was passing along between Samaria and Galilee. And as He entered a village, He was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." When He saw them He said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving Him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus answered, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" And He said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

C: Praise to You, O Christ.

THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH


The First Article and the Explanation as presented by Martin Luther in the Small Catechism

C: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

P: What does this mean?

C: I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, spouse and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is most certainly true.

THE PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

- P: With great thanksgiving for all God has given us, we pray for the whole people of God in Christ Jesus and all people according to their needs.
- C: We come before You, Lord with thankful hearts for all You have done. Lord, hear our prayer.
- P: Almighty God, we confess that You have given us all we have,
- C: yet we often foolishly think what we have is of our doing. Forgive us for our foolishness. Lord, hear our prayer.
- P: We remember those in our church family and those we know who are sick and suffering, including Travis Aldag, Michelle Kragel, and those whom we name in our hearts [silence for private prayer] Trusting in Your great mercy,
- C: We lift them up You, to the great heavenly physician, asking You, dear Lord, to bring healing and health, bringing remedies as only You can and according to Your will. Lord, hear our prayer.
- P: We recall that You have called us in Scripture to pray for kings and all in authority that we might live peaceful lives.
- C: We pray for every ruler in every land, including our President, Congress, all government officials and judges. Guide all by Your Holy Spirit to accomplish Your will on this earth, that Your kingdom may come to us and many others. Lord, hear our prayer.
- P: We are also reminded by Your Word to pray for those who are persecuted.
- C: We ask that You would be with them in their hour of trial; strengthen their faith and remind them of their great reward. Lord, hear our prayer.
- P: Each year, Your people of old would recall who they were because of Your blessings.
- C: We, like them, are nobody apart from You. Through the cross and empty tomb, You make us Yours by faith, members of Your family, for which we give You thanks. Lord, hear our prayer.
- P: Your Word calls us to remember the poor and those in need.
- C: By Your Holy Spirit, open our eyes that we may see those who are poor and in need that we can serve them. Lord, hear our prayer.
- P: Lord Jesus Christ, You have sent Your Holy Spirit into our hearts, by which we have believed Your Word and are members of Your kingdom.
- C: but we know there are those who do not believe in You. Use us by Your Spirit, according to Your will, that these ripe fields may bring a great harvest for Your glory. Lord, hear our prayer.
- P: We lift these and all the prayers of our hearts before Your throne, almighty God.
- C: We pray in the name of Jesus, who with You and the Holy Spirit is one God, now and forever. Amen.

THE PREFACE (responses are sung) (page 160 in the hymnal)

- P: The Lord be with you.
- C: And also with you.
- P: Lift up your hearts.
- C: We lift them to the Lord.

- P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- C: It is right to give Him thanks and praise.
- P: Almighty God, it is truly good, right, and salutary that we should offer You thanksgiving every day. You have blessed us in every way. You have provided for us all that we need for life; every day You pour out blessing after blessing upon us. The greatest blessing You have given us is in the forgiveness of sins through Jesus' life, death on the cross and Resurrection for us. Therefore with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven we laud and magnify Your glorious name, evermore praising You and saying:
- C: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of pow'r and might:
 Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna. Hosanna.
 Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.
 Hosanna in the highest.

THE PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

P: Blessed are You, Lord of heaven and earth, for You have had mercy on those whom You created, and sent Your only-begotten Son into our flesh to bear our sin and be our Savior. With repentant joy we receive the salvation accomplished for us by the all-availing sacrifice of His body and His blood on the cross. Gathered in the name and the remembrance of Jesus, we beg You, O Lord, to forgive, renew, and strengthen us with Your Word and Spirit. Grant us faithfully to eat His body and drink His blood as He bids us do in His own testament. Gather us together, we pray, from the ends of the earth to celebrate with all the faithful the marriage feast of the Lamb in His kingdom, which has no end. Graciously receive our prayers; deliver and preserve us. To You alone, O Father, be all glory, honor and worship, with the Son and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

P: The Lord bless you and keep you.


